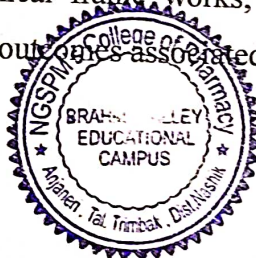

- 1. Pharmacy Knowledge:** Possess knowledge and comprehension of the core and basic knowledge associated with the profession of pharmacy, including biomedical sciences; Pharmaceutical science: behavioural, social and administrative pharmacy sciences and manufacturing practise.
- 2. Planning Abilities:** Demonstrate effective planning abilities including time management. Resource management delegation skills and organizational. Develop and implement plans and organize work to meet deadlines.
- 3. Problem analysis:** Utilize the principles of scientific enquiry, thinking analytically, clearly and critically, while solving problems and making decision during daily practice Find analyse evaluate and apply information systematically and shall make defensible decisions.
